I just said yes

I hit bottom during my kids' teenage years. Going into juvenile detention centers has been a way of giving back and showing up for teenagers

"Many times, I have gone to my old hospital in despair. On talking to a man there, I would be amazingly lifted up and set on my feet. It is a design for living that works in rough going."—"Bill's Story," Alcoholics Anonymous. This passage describes my experience every time I leave an AA meeting at a correctional facility. I feel "amazingly lifted up and set on my feet."

I have been carrying the message to incarcerated people for more than 18 years now. When I first got sober, I remember Sy T., now deceased, would announce upcoming corrections service opportunities at our meetings. Sometimes he'd pass me a note about signing up to go to a prison meeting. Sy often talked about how such meetings added to the quality of his sobriety. He felt this type of service was insurance against a slip. A few years later I was sitting in a meeting, and I was whining about stuff going on in my head and someone announced that volunteers were needed to carry the message into a juvenile detention center. I raised my hand and said yes. I did as my sponsor told me to do. I just said yes.

I hit bottom during my kids' teenage years. I held on to some guilt about that even after making amends to them. Going into juvenile detention centers has been a way of giving back and showing up for teenagers. My purpose there is simply to plant a seed of hope. What I get back is so much more—healing and forgiveness. I did not expect this. God did for me what I could not do for myself.

Each time we go to the county jail and clear the metal detector, the guard hands us a key to the room where the AA literature is kept. My heart is filled with gratitude when the guard hands me the key because I remember going to jail in handcuffs. Now the guard is handing me a key!

No matter where the meeting is—jail, juvenile detention, work release or prison—the women are so grateful for our visit. When the meeting starts and we share our experience, strength and hope, the language of the heart seems to take over the meeting. The honest sharing and gratitude of the women (some in prison for years) is a beautiful thing to experience.

I'm so grateful that I've said yes to carry our message to correction facilities. When life on life's terms gets hard, a regular commitment to these corrections meetings (going into the trenches) has not only helped me stay sober, but grateful. I really look forward to returning to in-person prison meetings when this COVID-19 finally ends!

Tom K presented the January financial report:

Current Month: Checking and savings accounts are reconciled – total cash as of 1.31.23 is \$65,683.83. Net of \$1,162.35 of sales tax leaves \$64,521.48 of available cash at 1.31.23. Monthly revenues were \$5,221.33 and monthly expenses were \$6,590.22 resulting in a net loss of (\$1,368.89). Contributions were \$3,686.45 and literature sales were \$1,534.38.

Year to Date: As of January 31, 2023 with the year 8.33% complete total revenues are \$5,221.33 which is 6.58% of the budgeted amount. Total contributions are at 6.51% of the budgeted amount, group contributions are at 7.64% of the budgeted amount and individual contributions are at 2.92% of the budgeted amount. Literature sales are at 7.1% of the budgeted amount. The year-to-date expenses are \$6,590.22 which is 10.30% of the budgeted amount. The year-to-date loss is (\$1,368.89) vs the year-to-date loss of (\$1,020.23) as of 1.31.22.

Comparison Year to Date January 2023 vs January 2022: The year-to-date revenues are flat as compared to last year - \$5,221.33 vs \$5,311.23. The year-to-date expenses are up (4.09%) as compared to last year - \$6,590.22 vs \$6,331.46. National Grid bill was \$465.12 vs \$157.07 last December.

Service Center: There were 125 total calls in January, down 11% from December and 88 total office visits, up 2% from the previous month. Service Center staff responded to 93 email inquiries, down 24% from December. In 2022, between office visits, phone calls and email responses, Service Center staff have managed a total of 4,555 contacts for the year. (See graph below.) 2022 online donations totaled \$696.20, of which the Service Center netted \$673.21. In addition, we redeemed \$430.17 in Rewards points on our credit card, which was used to reduce our credit card balance.

Intergroup: Tom H summarized the January Intergroup meeting. There was one new IR, Tom B (Pioneer Group). Will M presented the financial report. Ben B reported on Archives (appointed to this new committee by Tom H), Josh C reported on Technology, Andy C reported on Treatment, and Robert C reported on Literature. There were no reports for District/Area, Corrections, PI/CPC, Grapevine and Picnic and Steering committees. December minutes were unanimously approved. Under Old Business, Tom H nominated Adina S for 2023 Recording Secretary; passed unanimously. There was no New Business. Meeting adjourned at PM Old Business:


