OMG We're Broke

He had just gotten elected to be his group's new treasurer when the terrible news came in. No money? How would they ever pay the rent?

Tradition Seven: *Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.*

After my first 90 days sober, members of my home group suggested it was time for me to get active. I disagreed, but my sponsor thought it was a great idea. Soon after the position of group treasurer just happened to open up and my sponsor nominated me for the position. Before I knew what had happened, the group unanimously elected me to the job. Unanimous! Wow. I felt so pleased. However, it didn't take long for my ego to deflate. First, I was the sole candidate and second, my home group was not in great financial shape.

Though we regularly practiced the Seventh Tradition of passing the basket, our meeting the last few months had not yielded even close to enough money to meet all the group's expenses. Our rent was due the next week and that meant we would be in arrears. Our landlord had no sympathy, understanding of or interest in the AA program. If we didn't collect enough to pay the current rent, the unpaid balance would double what we needed next month.

Alarmed over the encroaching disaster, I called our group chairperson and advised him that we were in trouble. He scheduled a group conscience meeting for the next Saturday to address the shortage and discuss solutions.

When Saturday arrived, there was a knot in my stomach. I couldn't imagine how the group would survive. Even worse, it would all be happening on my watch! I would be known as the member in charge when our group sank into a sea of red ink.

Eleven group members showed up for the group conscience meeting. Eleven members were better than none, but I had expected many more. Didn't my fellow sober alcoholics realize this was a major disaster?

The group chairman opened the meeting, and the first order of business was the treasurer's report. I nervously read the miserable figures aloud, and when I finished there was an uncomfortable silence in the room. After what seemed like a long time, a senior member made a suggestion. "Why don't we pass the basket right now and bring our deficit up to date?" he proposed. "We can start looking at solutions once we better understand exactly where we stand."

Everyone agreed, and with only 11 people, the basket didn't take but three minutes to go around and then be returned to me. I began counting. It took less than three minutes. There were nine \$20 bills and two personal checks, each for \$100. My voice wavered as I read aloud the new treasury bottom line. We now had enough to pay the rent and had half of next month's expenses.

The oldtimer who had suggested passing the basket looked around and asked, "Anything else?" Everyone shook their heads no. "OK," he said. "Let's close with the Lord's Prayer." Our group conscience meeting lasted less than 10 minutes.

That's all it took for 11 group members to save us from disaster? My head was spinning. I needed to talk with my sponsor. I spoke to him rapidly, disjointedly. I wasn't sure how to explain the sudden deliverance from bankruptcy I had just witnessed.

My sponsor spelled out the meaning of the Seventh Tradition. He explained two reasons why AA groups must be self-supporting. Without it, our ultimate authority—a loving God—would be replaced by our new financial partner's board of directors, who would enthusiastically express their authority in our group conscience. Second, our primary purpose would be changed. The group's new primary purpose would be making a profit for our financier. Carrying the AA message to alcoholics who are suffering would no longer matter. The miracle of AA would be a distant memory, and we alcoholics would be facing our disease alone. Now I understood why the members took immediate action on our expense shortfall, out of their own pockets, without a second thought.

Many years later I still get chills when I think of that day and what it meant. My time as group treasurer brought about a humble appreciation of our Responsibility Declaration, read at the beginning of our meetings. "I am responsible. When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there. And for that: I am responsible."

Monthly Reports

● Finance—Jim M

- ▲ An income of \$3314.37 and expenses of -\$4325.85 resulted in a net operating income of -\$1011.48. Assets total \$96,170.29 and liabilities total -\$1883.10. Full report distributed in *Meeting Times* newsletter.

● District Liaison (Open Position; Walt B, DCM reported)

- ▲ Vote to remove “Eskimo” from the *Big Book*
- ▲ Officially voted to reduce Area meetings to six per year
- ▲ “Everything AA” app bought by GSO to retain rights to published material and avoid expensive litigation

Standing Committee Reports

● Corrections—Jeff T

- ▲ There are now six men on the Corrections Team. All six are bringing meetings into the Justice Center on Monday nights at 7:00 PM in teams of two, rotating between five pods. We had some difficulty bringing meetings in on June 1 and June 8. After two unsuccessful dates, I contacted the Justice Center with our concerns. I was assured that these were isolated incidents. We were successful on Monday 6/15. The team is hoping to start bringing meetings into the JC, two pods a week on Mondays at 7:00 p.m., two men per pod. The details are yet to be worked out. On 6/15 there were 10 attendees. That seems to be some kind of a record.
- ▲ There are three men bringing meetings into Jamesville Correctional on Wednesday morning at 10:00 a.m. We have three women on the Corrections Team. They bring a meeting to the Justice Center on the second Monday at 7:00 PM and a meeting to Jamesville Correctional on the third Thursday at 10:00 a.m. I just became aware that no meetings were brought into Jamesville the past month or so due to lack of interest from the inmates. I have not addressed this with Jamesville yet.

- ▲ We have distributed AA *Pocket Big Books* to each member of the team to give to inmates when appropriate. We also have other literature that we offer to the inmates. We are consistently looking for donations of the *Grapevine* to give to the inmates. We have had an offer of *Grapevine* subscriptions from the District. I have also had offers for literature from Sunrise Sobriety Zoom and may suggest *Grapevine* subscriptions from them. There are six pods at the Justice Center. I am unsure how many pods at Jamesville. I will try to gather information from Jamesville before determining how many *Grapevine* subscriptions are needed to cover all pods.
- ▲ If you hear of anyone who has interest in bringing meetings into the correctional facilities, please direct them to contact me, Jeff T.

● Treatment—Jason D

- ▲ Committee is asking groups to sponsor a month of bringing meetings into local treatment centers, Helio Elements, Helio Willows, Commonwealth Rehabilitation Center, VanDuyn Center for Rehabilitation & Nursing. The committee has created a grid to coordinate these commitments and circulated in the *Meeting Times* newsletter. - **Intergroup Inventory Discussion Question:** Does your home group currently have an active Intergroup Representative? If not, what are the primary reasons the position is vacant?
 - ▲ Walt B: reported about groups being between reps, volunteers have challenges maintaining commitments
 - ▲ Hugh B, Bruce L, Jim M: small home groups have a difficult time finding enough people available and willing to maintain service commitments
 - ▲ Alec V: even large groups have difficulty finding members willing to take on commitments
 - ▲ Jeff T: current IG rep trying desperately to find a successor
- **Intergroup Self-Inventory:** Intergroup Self-Inventory: Does Syracuse Intergroup emphasize the importance of Intergroup participation? How effectively? And how can we do better?
 - ▲ Jason D: historically, the group hasn't done this well, but the ad hoc committee on IG Awareness is an effort to improve
 - ▲ Hugh B: it's hard to talk about what we do when we don't do it
 - ▲ Walt B: Area 47 decision to reduce number of meetings might make it a more manageable commitment and encourage service participation
 - ▲ Shelly H: suggested a flyer to advertise purpose of Intergroup in halls
 - ▲ Samantha M: What is a realistic goal for IG participation? Also suggested that new meeting registration or meeting changes would be a good opportunity to encourage groups to participate in Intergroup and General Service
 - ▲ Matt S: many people believe that they have to know what they're doing before getting started
 - ▲ Samantha M: it's helpful to communicate the "why" of Intergroup when encouraging participation
 - ▲ Bob R: There are a lot of meetings but not a lot of groups. When groups function as groups, they conduct business of AA and have more structure for getting trusted servants to make service commitments

New Business

- Alec V made a motion to begin discussion of adopting Google Workspace, Bruce L seconded.
 - ▲ Hugh B described the platform and eligibility of Intergroup as a non-profit
 - ▲ Steve A asked who is the owner of the account
 - ▲ Bob R proposed that, even if the service is provided for free, 7th tradition self-support would require us to self-assess a fee for the service

- ▲ Walt B pointed out that Intergroup is not part of AA general service structure, so the self-support wouldn't apply
- ▲ Samantha M pointed out that this structure would reinforce anonymity
- Samantha M made a motion to table, seconded by Bruce L (13 in favor)
 - Alec V made a motion to close the meeting; seconded by Bruce L
- ▲ Meeting adjourned and closed with the Declaration of Unity, led by Hugh B.

Tradition Seven (Long Form)

"The A.A. groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then, too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money and authority."

Concept Seven (Short Form)

"The Charter and Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments, empowering the trustees to manage and conduct world service affairs. The Conference Charter is not a legal document; it relies upon tradition and the A.A. purse for final effectiveness."
